GLANCING THOUGHTS — TRUE HUMILITY AND TALENTS

Some people think that humility is a matter of taking yourself to be small, unworthy, not up for much.

But, in the <u>Gospel</u> parable, the servant is dismissed as wicked and useless, if he thinks he is too little to do much with his talent, and his talent is taken away from him. The Lord doesn't praise him for humility.

So what is humility? It is the opposite of pride—but what is pride? Pride isn't denying that there is some excellence, some talent, in yourself when there really is. Rather, pride is a failure to recognise that that talent is given you by the Lord.

Of course, we are small and unworthy. What else would we be? Our talents are not a function of what we are and can do. Every excellence in us is a gift of the Lord's. We can acknowledge the excellence that is truly in us without danger of pride, provided we remember that such excellence comes from the Lord.

Not only that, but in the <u>Gospel</u> Reading our Lord announces a funny distribution principle: to him who has, more will be given. So here is the idea. A person who does not refuse a gift of the Lord's receives it and consequently has more. Then, because he has more, the Lord will offer him another gift. If he does not refuse that new gift, it will be given—and so he will have more. And then more will be given to him. And so on and on, till a person blazes in glory for the Lord.

Unlike the useless servant in the parable, then, we can aim as high as we like, with true humility, provided we recognise as gift every excellence we have. Everything is gift, and everything is meant to be given back in service of love for the Lord.

St Mary's Restoration Project (All under one roof)

The Restoration Steering Group met on Friday to hear confirmation that our grant application to Historic Environment Scotland (HES) for £100K has been accepted. This is good news although it's only another step in the process which now sees HES send out their own experts to access for themselves the work that St Mary's requires, and for us to update the estimates that were submitted at the beginning of the year. Parish Leadership Team— I continue to meet with the Parish Leadership Team weekly for 2 hours of prayer, discernment, planning and decision making. The Leadership Team comprises Jim Murphie (trainee deacon); James Milne, Marian Milne and Anne Hampton. To give you a flavour of what we are about please see the minutes of our last meeting below:

- Discussion on Divine Renovation three keys supplemented with the video.
- Discussion on Alpha and its successor programme. Was noted the importance of continuing formation with the next programme. Later discussion on disagreements and how to deal with it within the context of Alpha.
- Discussion on Sycamore possibly being used during advent.
- Discussion on RCIA: RCIA to possibly involve Bp. Robert Barron's Catholicism. The importance of continuing the prayer ministry elements from Alpha was noted. RCIA team to be formed.
- Discussion on possible new charitable causes for the parish to contribute. Possibilities: sponsoring a girls' school in Pakistan, local projects, SCIAF's well projects. Was noted that the parish already supports numerous charities including Wells.
- Discussion on holiday cover and the funerals that took place while Fr Jim was absent.
- Discussion on Hall restoration. Year planner put in sacristy for the Hall bookings.
- Discussion on liturgy rota, still only one reader for the vigil mass. PowerPoint team doing well.
- Discussion on Feast of Christ the King. Father Jim to investigate. Sentiment shared that rushing it is not ideal as only two weeks to go.
- Discussion on prayers before mass. Suggested that priest, servers, readers etc all to come into sacristy 10 minutes before mass to prepare in prayer. Agreed that altar server prayers used before mass.
- Discussion on parish social events. Jack the Ripper to go ahead on the 17th of November. Three weeks given for Christmas dinner menu.
- Discussion on parish council. Father Jim to ask Ann Creegan to chair the meeting as he will not be available.
- Discussion on Church sign, poorly positioned, not very visible at all.

New Liturgy Rota available and will be starting 5th November. The Second Vatican Council called for active participation of the laity in the liturgy and to help with this our Sunday Mass will now have a separate reader for each of the two readings and a cantor to sing the psalm, as well as someone to read the Prayers of the Faithful, and Welcomers to greet people at the door. The other important ministry of bringing down the gifts will be arranged on the day, with a variety of people being asked.

Please keep 5 minutes silence before the start of each Sunday Mass. The bell will ring 5 minutes before Mass to mark the start of silence. This creates a decompression chamber in which we acclimatise to the Sacred and come into God's presence.
