**Reflection by Mgr Aldo on Synodality:** We are celebrating today the great Mystery of the Holy Eucharist. Who can ever hope to grasp its meaning? We can only glimpse dimly into its awesome depths. What we can grasp is love. We know what it means to be loved and how to be lovable. The Holy Scriptures of the Church, the learned men who went before s, the saintly man and women and especially those who faced death and at times the most horrendous torture, bear witness to the truth that there is something higher and more precious to us that all the riches and material pleasures of this world. There are many signs which point to these eternal values, which can only be

grasped by Faith. Wise men taught us about God., "Theology" they call it and they define it as "Faith seeking understanding". The History of the Church tells us much about the high points of that faith journey in its search for the TRUTH. Many Councils of great Churchmen, under the inspiration of the Holy Spirit helped to refine and make as clear as possible what that truth is in their own time and facing their own challenges and crisis. That journey of faith continues to this day, with its own crisis in the Church and in the world. What is God telling us now in our world, in or Church today? Are we listening? Pope Francis has se us on a journey together, on the same road, to listen to God and to each other. This is the greatest exercise of "Listening" in the history of the Church....nothing less than a radical transformation our shared life in the church....through listening to one another. And that means, in the simple, human language of everyday life, for the Pope wants every baptised person, in their dignity of sharing in the common priesthood of all the baptised and as members of the priestly, prophetic and royal People of God, to give living witness to their faith, their joys and their wounds and hurts, in and outside, the Church. Already millions of Catholics have taken part in meetings, at parish, diocesan and continental levels, sharing and airing their views. Not to produce documents or dogmas, but to open horizons of hope for the fulfilment of the Church's Mission, not just for herself but for all Christians and for all of humanity. This is at the root and essence of what is meant by "Synodality". Oh Loving and Mysterious God, be among us as we, the disciples of Jesus travel the road of communion, participation and mission, together.

#### **GLANCING THOUGHTS—HEY, YOU!**

In the <u>Gospel</u> Reading, there is a squall at sea, and the apostles' boat begins to take on water. They are very afraid; and they wake up Jesus, who is asleep in the back of the boat. He calms the sea. And then he asks his disciples two questions: Why are you terrified? Don't you yet have faith?

Why are they terrified? Well, because that boat is filling up with water, the wind is fierce, the waves are high, and there is an excellent chance that everybody in the boat will die by drowning. What is not to fear here?

And why does Jesus ask them *if they have faith*? The <u>First Reading</u> is from the book of Job. Job certainly had faith—and he lost all his children and his possessions in one day, shortly before he came down with a loathsome skin disease. If having faith won't save a person from the fate of Job, then why wouldn't the disciples fear, even if they had faith?

The solution lies in seeing how Jesus rescues his disciples from shipwreck. He doesn't issue decrees about the weather. He talks directly to the sea. "Be still!" he says to the sea. And notice that in the <a href="First Reading">First Reading</a> this is exactly how God deals with the ocean. Just as Jesus says "you" to the sea, so God says "you" to the ocean: "So far shall you come and no further." For God, for Jesus, even inanimate objects such as the ocean and the sea have an I-Thou relationship with their Lord. Even the sea and the ocean are in direct second-personal relationship with the loving God who made them.


And if this is true of the ocean and the sea, then how much more is it true of each one of us? So faith is not the bare belief that there is a God. Faith is the willingness, in trust, to say "you" to God, as God says "you" to each one of us.

In this I-Thou relationship with the good and loving Creator of all there is, what is left to fear?

Whether we live or die, whether we sorrow or are at ease, we stand in joy in the love of our Lord.

And that is why we do not have to be afraid.

The cemetery contains many graves of the Little Sisters as well as Sisters of Mercy and several diocesan priests including Fr Francis Beurms: a Belgian born priest who served as Priest-in-charge of St Mary's Lochee from



1872 to 1880. He died in Newport in 1895 and was buried in Wellburn. Mgr Kenneth McCaffrey, a lifelong friend of The Little Sisters, blessed the graves in the presence of several Associates of the Little Sisters who helped at Wellburn. May the Lord bless all those associated with The Little Sisters and Wellburn; and May the souls of their faithful departed rest in peace.
